Larry Gene Greenwood, age 76 of Bellevue, NE passed away on Sunday, July 19, 2020 at the Bellevue Medical Center.

He was born on March 14, 1944 to LaMar Luther and Dorothy Etha (Peters) Greenwood in Allentown, PA. He was raised and schooled in Albuquerque and Truth of Consequences, NM. Larry graduated from Durango High School in Durango, CO and then he attended college for two years before enlisting in the U.S. Air Force. While serving his country he finished college, earning a degree in Electrical Engineering. Larry was stationed in England, Germany, Japan, Vietnam, and in the U.S. in Washington, Florida, Mississippi, and he retired from the Air Force at Offutt Air Force Base in Bellevue, NE in 1983.

Larry proudly served his county for twenty years. Then he worked for the Harris Corporation Gould Control ESU #3 until he retired in 2012.

Larry was a member of the Fraternal Order of Eagles Aerie #365 in Plattsmouth and American Legion Post #8 of Nebraska City, NE.
